Grammy-winner Patti Austin headlines VU jazz fest next week

effrey Brown, coordinator of jazz studies at Valparaiso University, says it took a while for his university's annual jazz festival to become established on a national level. "When I first started booking this years back, I had to

explain where Valparaiso is," he said. "Interestingly, over the last four, five to maybe six years, when I would talk to artists, they would say 'oh yeah. I've heard of the festival! It's established a reputation for offering an excellent level of musical entertainment."

Kicking off April 13 and running through April 18 at VU's Harre Union, this year marks the 24th running of VU's Jazz Fest. In the last quarter century-plus, VU has hosted jazz greats such as Clark Terry, Maynard

> Ferguson, the Count Basie band and Randy Brecker, to name a few, at its annual festival.

This year, VU brings vocal great Patti Austin and acclaimed pianist Monty Alexander to Harre Union for this year's festival. Alexander is scheduled to release his newest collection, "Calypso Blues,"

soon, while Austin received her first-ever Grammy award in 2008 for Best Jazz Vocal Album for her
